

Mathematics Department Grading Policy

2020-2021 School Year

This policy applies to the following courses:

Algebra 1, Algebra 1 PreAP, Geometry, Geometry PreAP, Algebraic Reasoning, Algebra 2, Algebra 2 PreAP, PreCalculus, Statistics, AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, College Preparatory Mathematics, OnRamps PreCalculus (HS Only), and OnRamps Algebra 2 (HS Only)

Grading policy

- No single grade will count for more than 30% of the six weeks average.
- All teachers will update their gradebooks at least once per week, and input at least 6 grades per grading cycle regardless of the length of that grading cycle.
- Grades weights will be consistent by course and communicated via a syllabus to students and parents.

Late work policy

- Students may submit assignments up to three calendar days after the original due date with a 10% penalty per day.
- After five calendar days, a student may earn up to a grade of 50 for the assignment if he/she completes the assignment.
- Teachers have the option, but are not required, to give students an alternative assignment that will be due within the same time frame as the original assignment.

Make up work

Make up work will be accepted without penalty with a documented, excused absence. The student will have one extra class day for every class day they are absent plus one extra class day to turn in the assignment. Additional time can be negotiated with the teacher based upon individual circumstances and needs.

Mastery/Retesting

Teachers will offer students an opportunity for retesting and/or test corrections on formal exams not mastered (74 or below). To be eligible for the retest or test corrections the student may be required to receive tutoring by the teacher. The highest grade a student can make on retest is a 75.

Extra Credit

If offered, extra credit will be curriculum-related, agreed upon by all members who teach the course, and offered to all students in the course.
